

WORKSHOP

August 26, 1991

The Board of County Commissioners, Walton County, Florida met in a regular Workshop session on Monday, August 26, 1991, at 8:00 A.M., in the County Commission Boardroom of the Walton County Courthouse.

The following Board members were present: Chairman Sam Pridgen, Vice-Chairman W. F. Miles, Commissioner Gordon Porter, and Commissioner Wilson Holley. The Board's Administrative Supervisor, Mr. Ronnie E. Bell, was also present.

Chairman Pridgen opened the Workshop for discussions.

Mr. James Ellis, Foreman for the County landfill, presented the Board with a progress report sale of the landfill.

Mr. Ellis advised the Board that a permit is needed at the cost of \$5,000.00 that is required by the Department of Environmental Regulations (DER).

Mr. Bell advised the Board that the projected date to begin the Recycling Program is October 1, 1991.

Mr. Bell informed the Board that Mr. Art Hatten requests the Board's consideration for constructing a parking area behind the Health Department.

Mr. Bell also advised the Board that he will be presenting two Mutual Aid Fire Agreements to the Board for approval at tomorrow's Regular Meeting.

Mr. Ronnie Hudson, Public Works Director, informed the Board that the clay for the Fairground parking lot adjacent to the Fairground building will be delivered and the parking area ready in time for this year's fair.

Mrs. Shirl Williams, Assistant Administrative Supervisor, advised the Board that a representative from Greenwood Development would appear at tomorrow's Regular session to request the Board approve their development.

Mrs. Williams advised the Board that the Planning Commission met on August 15, 1991, and recommends that the Board approve Mr. Edward Chadman's request for a Batch Plant.

Mrs. Williams presented the Board with three projects for the

Board's approval: Lakewood Pointe Estates, Shortline Lake Estates Phase III, and Sunrise Beach.

Commissioner Holley advised the Board that his road foreman, Mr. Johnny Lindsey, is in need of a possible liver transplant. Commissioner Holley inquired about loaning Mr. Lindsey leave time during the surgery and recovery period.

Vice-Chairman Miles suggested the Board notify the District 5 foreman, Mr. Tom Henry, to send equipment to assist in the Industrial Park project in Freeport.

Mrs. Martha Ingle, Chief Deputy Clerk, advised the Board that the emergency buzzer system in the Judges and County Clerk's offices has alarmed by mistake on several occasions. Mr. Howard Newsome, from New-Tel Communications, prepared a fixed proposal for a wireless alarm. Mrs. Ingle suggested the Building Department, Clerk's offices, and the Tax Collector's offices also have the alarm system installed.

Mrs. Ingle advised the Board of an incoming resolution regarding the burning of hazardous wastes in boilers, industrial furnaces, cement kilns, incinerators, or otherwise within the State of Florida.

Mrs. Ingle also advised the Board of the Tourist Development Tax Ordinance and incoming letters regarding the projected Dog Ordinance.

Vice-Chairman Miles suggested the Board meet with the legislature regarding the State prisoners and the County being responsible for providing attorneys for the prisoners.

Chairman Pridgen adjourned the Workshop.
