

WORKSHOP

NOVEMBER 9, 1992

The Board of County Commissioners, Walton County, Florida met in a regular Workshop session on Monday, November 9, 1992 at 8:00 A.M., in the Commission Boardroom of the Walton County Courthouse.

The following Board members were present: Chairman Sam Pridgen, Vice-Chairman Robert G. Fleet, Commissioner W. F. Miles, Commissioner Wilson Holley, and Commissioner Gordon Porter. The Board's Administrative Supervisor, Mr. Ronnie E. Bell, was also present.

Chairman Pridgen opened the Workshop for discussion.

Mr. Bell, Administrative Supervisor to the Board, advised the Board of the advertisement in the DeFuniak Herald regarding Argus Services Inc. and Waste Management Inc. of Florida.

Mr. Bell advised the Board that after researching several bonding agencies, Peck Cawthon Insurance Agency was the Company with the least expensive price of \$50.00 each for the Elected Official Bonds.

Mrs. Shirl Williams, Assistant Administrative Supervisor to the Board, advised the Board of the Salvage Yard Ordinance to be approved in tomorrow's regular meeting. Mrs. Williams stated that the recommended order from the Administration Commission will be discussed in tomorrow's regular meeting.

Glory Brown, Purchasing Agent, advised the Board that the cost for the hay blower that was demonstrated last week is approximately \$9400.00.

Vice-Chairman Fleet stated that he has three contract labor employees in his district that he would like to hire as full-time employees.

Mr. Holley stated that he would like to donate the old international tractor from District 3 to the Walton County Association of Retarded Citizens (ARC).

Mrs. Martha Ingle, Chief Deputy Clerk, advised the Board of a letter from the Walton County Council on Aging informing the Board that they will reimburse the Walton County Commission for any and all supplies that may be purchased by the Commission for the purpose of renovating the old canning center next to Commander Funeral Home at 3 Main Street in DeFuniak Springs, Florida.

Mrs. Ingle also advised the Board of a letter from Tri-County Community Council requesting the Board appoint a representative to serve as a Director on the Tri-County Community Council, Inc. Board of Directors.

Mrs. Ingle further advised the Board of an Elected Official Bond to be approved from Sheriff Quinn McMillian.

Mrs. Ingle asked the Board if contract labor employees should be required to have physicals as do full-time employees. All County employees either full-time or part-time are covered under the County's Workers Compensation Insurance.

Mrs. Ingle advised the Board that the amended plat presented by Mr. Granger Bruner on March 10, 1992 was not signed. The Board agreed to direct Mr. George R. Miller, County Attorney, to meet with Mr. Bruner regarding the matter.

Mr. Ronnie Hudson, Public Works Director, advised the Board that he was in the process of locating a used dump trailer to be utilized at the County Landfill for the purpose of dumping garbage into the new cell.

Chairman Pridgen adjourned the Workshop.
