

March 8th, 1927.

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida, met in regular session on this Tuesday, March 8th, 1927, with the following members present and participating, G M Bishop, R L Jones, W M Infinger, J J Ward and W I Stinson, Chairman.

W F Jones, Tax Collector filed his report of Licenses collected for the period ending Feb'y 28th, 1927, showing \$72.00 collected for the State and \$36.00 for Walton County, and his report of Polls collected for the period ending Feb'y 28, 1927, showing \$65.00 collected.

The Chairman and Clerk was authorized to dismiss the services of Margaret Jordan as jantrass and was further authorized to employ some one in her place if they deemed it advisable, and for the best interest of the County.

P. Permenter appeared before the board asking for relief in regard to his 1926 taxes, stating that he sold his cattle in April, 1926. Board advised him they could not grant relief in the matter as the assessment was made up as of January 1st, 1926.

Confederate Widow's pension claim of Mrs Cynthia Padgett, Darlington, Fla. R #2, and confederate widow's pension claim of Mary Jane Evans, Freeport, Fla. was approved and ordered forwarded to State Comptroller for further consideration.

Upon motion of Commissioner G M Bishop, seconded by Commissioner J J Ward, the following resolution was unanimously adopted,-

Whereas, at a Special meeting of this board held on Feb'y 17, 1927, a resolution was passed requesting our Senator and Representative to pass a validating Act thru the coming legislature, validating and confirming the issue of \$1,000,000.00 in bonds for the building of certain State Roads and certain County Roads so laid out and named to be built in the petition calling for said election, and

Whereas, there is now a very active movement on foot to build and complete what is known as the "Loop System" of roads in the State of Florida, and knowing that if this system of roads are built and completed in the near future that it will be, because of the assistance of the several different Counties thru which it passes, and

Whereas, State Road #10 (Coastal Highway) a part of this Loop System of roads passes thru our County on the North side of Choctawhatchee Bay, and this Board being desirous of assisting the State Road Department in the bridging of Choctawhatchee River with a Free bridge, and also assisting the said State Road Department in the building of said road, and necessary bridges thereon to a greater extent than it will be able to do from the \$1,000,000.00 bond issue, and

Whereas, this Board has requested our Senator and Representative to designate an additional State Road in this County to be known as State Road No.10A to leave the Walton-Bay County Line on the East and run down the Santa Rosa Peninsular to the Naval Reservation on the West end of the Peninsular, touching the towns of Point Washington, Santa Rosa and Grayton Beach either by main line or spur lines built from the main line,

Now Therefore, Be it Resolved that our Senator and Representative, is requested to, in addition to validating our \$1,000,000. bond issue, to pass an act authorizing this Board to issue bonds of this County or Special Dist. #3, in the sum of \$500,000.00 additional, \$300,000. of which will be used for building a bridge across the Choctawhatchee River at the place commonly known as the Cow Ford, and building a road and necessary bridges from the said bridge to Bruce to Freeport to Portland and along the North shores of Choctawhatchee Bay to the Walton-Okaloosa County line, providing however that if the specific route named is made that part of State Road No.10, passing thru Walton County, then this Board is authorized to deliver over to the State Road Department these bonds or the funds derived from the sale of them, when the said State Road Department is ready to begin the construction of said Cow Ford bridge and road heretofore authorized with necessary bridges thereon,

and \$200,000. to be used for the building of road and the necessary bridges on road heretofore referred to, to be designated as State Road No.10 , said road to be built on State Specification, and when the State Road Department will agree to take same over for maintenance. Also providing that any monies available, for building County roads along the proposed route of the foregoing outlined roads, may be used as additional funds for building of any of the State or County roads, designated in the \$1,000,000. issue, and further resolved that our Senator and Representative be requested to repeal the act authorizing and creating Special Road & Bridge District No.2, as now created, and further resolved that the action heretofore made in regard to creating a toll-bridge across Chocawhatchee River be rescinded.
