

REGULAR MEETING, April 12th, 1927.

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Fla., met in regular session on this Tuesday, April 12th, 1927, with the following members present and participating, G M Bishop, J J Ward, W M Infinger, R L Jones and W I Stinson, Chairman.

W F Jones, Tax Collector, filed his reports of Polls collected for the period ending March 31st, 1927, showing \$159.00 collected, and his report of Licenses collected for the period ending March 31st, 1927, showing \$97.00 for the State and \$48.50 for Walton County.

Messrs Lewis, Hall and Clemmons, County Commissioners from Calhoun County, Fla. appeared before the Board in regard to our lease with them for our County Convicts, and also a letter from Mr J A Peacock, Clerk Circuit Court, Calhoun County, Fla. was read to the Board in regard to our Lease with them, and after considerable discussion pro and con, upon motion made by G M Bishop, seconded by W M Infinger and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that we continue leasing our county convicts to Calhoun County, Fla. under same contract until Sept. 30th, 1927 which was agreeable with the present members of the Board of County Commissioners of Calhoun County, Fla.

Upon motion made by G M Bishop, seconded by J J Ward, and duly carried by unanimous vote of all members present, it was ordered that the following be the order of business for each regular meeting of this Board hereafter. In the forenoon, considering and approving bills and reading the minutes of the Board and in the afternoon, open meeting for general business.

Mr. Dow Jordon, appeared before the Board in regard to the right-of-way on Indian Creek road thru his property, and after considerable discussion, it was moved by G M Bishop seconded by W M Infinger and duly carried, ordered that a warrant issue in favor of Dow Jordon for \$25.00 for a Fifty (50ft) foot right-of-way thru his land, providing he would give the county a warranty deed for same.

Upon motion of Mr G M Bishop, seconded by Mr W M Infinger and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that a warrant be drawn in favor of H Bludworth for \$1100.00 as an advance of approximately 50% of the cost of material on the ground to be used in the construction of Bruce Creek bridge, this being in addition to the 75% advance for materials in place as provided for in the contract, the warrant for \$1100.00 to be delivered when agreement to this advance has been signed by the bondsmen.

Upon motion of Mr G M Bishop, seconded by Mr J J Ward and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that a warrant be drawn in favor of Willie Helms and C E Bishop, for \$500.00 as an advance of approximately 50% of the work done on the Bruce Creek fills, this warrant to be delivered when agreement to this advance has been signed by the bondsmen, no

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provision having been made in the original contract for advances.

Moved by R L Jones and seconded by W M Infinger, and duly carried, ordered that the name of Mrs Margie George, Flora a, Ala. Stella Rte, be placed upon the Mother's Pension list to receive \$8.00 per month until further orders of this Board.

And further ordered that the name of Oscar George, Florala, Ala. Stella Rte, c/o of Mrs Margie George, be placed upon the Pauper's list to receive \$4.00 per month until further orders of this Board.

Upon motion made by G M Bishop, seconded by W M Infinger, and duly carried, ordered that the order heretofore on March 29th, 1927. made appointing Gus King and Oscar Bray as Road overseers on roads therein designated be rescinded, and further ordered that

Harvey Thorp be and he is hereby appointed as Road Overseer on road from Sarah D McDonald's place to Holmes County line near Jim Brannon's place, on road known as Knox Hill and Ponce de Leon road, and further ordered that

Walker Bray, be and he is hereby appointed as Road Overseer on road from Argyle to Red Hill Bridge on Bruce Creek on road known as Argyle and Eucheeanna road.

The application of Mrs E J Hemphill for help from the widow's relief fund, was ordered referred to the School Board for their consideration.

The Members of this Board agreed to go and inspect the work done by M C Ward under contract near Darlington and Gaskin on April 1st, 1927, (Friday.)

Mr D O Carter, appeared before the board in regard to a change in a road near his farm on the Florala and DeFuniak Road and after consideration discussion, pro and con, upon motion of R L Jones, seconded by G M Bishop, and duly carried, ordered that D O Carter be and he is hereby authorized to change road to West side of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec 35 Tp 4 N R 20 W from thru the forty, providing he will open up the right-of-way and put in as good condition as the present road is now in.

Contract and Bond of C G Gaaney, for building and constructing road and bridges on the Pt. Washington and Bay County line road was approved with C E Thorp and Henry Farris as sureties.

Notary Public Bond of Paul M Work, \$500. was approved with American Surety Co. of New York as surety.

Notary public bond of Lynn L Nealley, 500. was approved with American Surety Co. of New York as surety.

The minutes of this Board for the meeting held on December 27, 1926, January 3rd, 4th, 8th, 14th and 29th, 1927, February 8th, 17th and 21st, 1927, March 8th and 29th, 1927, was read and after minor correction, upon motion of G M Bishop, seconded by W M Infinger, was ordered approved.

It was ordered that the next regular meeting of this Board will be held on May 5th, 1927, and that due notice be given by publication in each one of the local papers, the second Tuesday coming during a term of the Circuit Court.

The following bills against the various county funds were then considered and being found correct and legally due, upon motion made by G M Bishop, seconded by J J Ward and duly carried by unanimous vote, were ordered paid and warrants drawn therefor as follows, to-wit:
