 The Chairman was authorized to purchase oil-asphalt and slay for use on new bridge and fill over and across Bruce Creek, now under construction.

It was ordered that due notice be published in the DeFuniak Herald that this Board would receive sealed bids until 10 o'clock A.M., Tuesday, July 5th, 1927, for the clearing and stumping of 893 feet of right of way southward from the new Bruce Creek bridge and for the excavation of approximately 1000 cubic yards of earth from same roadway. All to be done as per specifications on file in the Clerk's office. Cashier's or certified check for \$50. will be required with each Bid. Bids will be submitted for completed job. Successful bidder will be required to enter into bond for 50% of amount of his bid. Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Commissioner G. M. Bishop, was authorized to have fills across Bruce Creek clayed with a good grade of clay, providing the cost would not exceed \$300.00.

Deputy Sheriff Bond of Hiltz Crook, for \$1000.00 was approved with American Surety Co. of New York as surety.

Notary Public Bond of W. A. McNeill, for \$500.00 was approved with T J Britton and E P Rodwell, as sureties.

The Minutes of the meetings of this Board held on April 12th, and 27th, May 5th, 1927, was read and upon motion made by J J Ward, seconded by G M Bishop and duly carried by unanimous vote, were ordered approved as read.

The following Resolution having been submitted by the Gulf Power Company to this Board and this Board having submitted the same to Hon. D. Stuart Gillis, County Attorney for his consideration, and he advising the Board that he saw nothing in it detrimental to the best interest of Walton County, Fla., and thought it would be to the best interest of Walton County to have same adopted,-

Upon ---- motion made by Commissioner J J Ward, seconded by Commissioner G M Bishop, and duly carried by unanimous vote, the following Resolution was ordered adopted.

RESOLUTION granting to Gulf Power Company, its successors and assigns, the right and authority to erect, maintain and operate tower, pole and wire lines along, on and across the public roads, highways, public ways, and streets outside of incorporated cities and towns in Walton County, Florida.

WHEREAS Gulf Power Company is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maine and authorized to do business in the State of Florida and by its charter is authorized and empowered to manufacture, distribute, supply and sell to the public electric energy produced by steam or by water as a motive force or by both for lighting, heating, power and other purposes; and

WHEREAS said Company desires to erect, maintain and operate tower, pole and wire lines along, on and across the public roads, highways, public ways, and streets outside of incorporated cities and towns in Walton County, Florida, for the transmission, distribution, supply and sale of such electric energy to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida; that the said Gulf Power Company, its successors and assigns, be and is hereby given, granted and vested with the power, right and authority to erect, maintain and operate tower, pole and wire lines on, along and across the several public roads, highways, public ways, and streets outside of incorporated cities and towns in said County of Walton as now laid out and as may hereafter be laid out and extended, for the transmission, distribution, supply and sale to the public of such electric energy and of selling and supplying power, heat, light and electricity to the public, together with all instrumentalities and appliances necessary, convenient or useful in connection therewith for such purposes, and together with all the rights now or hereafter conferred by law that are necessary, useful or convenient to the enjoyment of such rights and privileges for such uses and purposes.

And be it RESOLVED FURTHER, that such right and authority herein granted are subject to the following conditions and regulations, viz:

a. The tower, pole and wire lines shall be constructed as nearly along the margin of such public roads, highways, public ways and streets as practicable and in no event shall the road beds be occupied nor shall the shoulders or drainage ditches be unreasonably interfered with or **disturbed** and the construction, maintenance and operation of such lines shall be conducted in such manner as not to unreasonably interfere with the free passage of traffic on such public roads, highways, public ways and streets.

b. All wires stretched along, across and on said public roads, highways, public ways and streets shall be of such height as to admit of the free passage of vehicles travelling thereon.

c. Such towers, poles and wires shall be so constructed, stretched and maintained as to prevent the falling of same on or across said public roads, highways, public ways and streets and the rights of way thereof and in the event same are blown down by winds or fall from other causes the said Company shall with reasonable dispatch remove and reconstruct the same so as to clear said roads, highways, public ways and streets and rights of way for the free passage of traffic thereon.

d. Said Company, its successors and assigns, shall hold the County of Walton and its officials harmless from any and all liability, loss or damage of every nature and character whatsoever which may be asserted or adjudged against them because or by reason of the permission granted by these resolutions and of any act done or omitted by said Company in exercising such permission which may give rise to a claim of liability, loss or damage.

e. Said Company, its successors and assigns, shall with reasonable diligence at their expense replace, repair and make good any damage, harm or injury to said public roads, highways, public ways and streets, their surfaces and the drainage thereof which may happen or be caused by falling towers, poles and wires or by the presence, construction, repair, maintenance or operation of its said lines; whether such damage, harm or injury arises from said Company's fault or from natural causes or otherwise.

The letter having been read in full, and the Board considering this letter as a withdrawal of his proposition submitted on June 7th, 1927, in reference to validating the bond issues authorized by the recent session of the Legislature, it was ordered by the Board that the letter be spread upon the minutes of this Board as a matter of information to the general public.

Mr. G. B. Sawyers, representing G. B. Sawyers Co. of Jacksonville, Fla., appeared before the Board along with other interested parties in regard to our proposed bond issues, and made the following proposition,-

June 14th, 1927.

Hon. Board of County Commissioners,
Walton County, Fla.

Gentlemen:

In connection with the \$1,250,000.00 of Road Bonds, the \$300,000.00 of Bridge Bonds and \$40,000.00 of Jail Bonds of Walton County, Fla. all of which are authorized to be issued under provisions of special acts of the Legislature of 1927, we wish to present to you the following proposal.

We propose:

First: That in cooperation with your County Attorney and our Attorney who shall be a Bond Attorney of National reputation, we are to prepare all proceedings necessary to the issuance and sale of said bonds including proceedings or validation should same be required, and notices of sale of said bonds, all to the end that at the time of the advertised sale of bonds, the bond blanks and preliminary approving opinion of Bond Attorney be on hand for delivery to purchaser of bonds.

Second: That said bonds be in denomination of I,000.00 shall be dated July 1st, 1927, to bear interest at not exceeding six per-cent payable semi-annually and interest and principal payable at the National Bank of Commerce in the City of New York. Said Bonds to mature as may be by resolution provided not exceeding thirty years from date of bonds.

Third: We will pay all expense incurred in the issuance and sale of bonds including that of validation if required, the cost of bond blanks, the advertising for sale locally as provided by law, advertising in the Bond Buyer, the services of Bond Attorney and

the cost of having printed and distributed among buyers of bonds as dealers a descriptive pamphlet which pamphlet shall contain a copy of the official notice of sale of bonds, a financial statement, information concerning the County which will be of interest to dealers and a form of bid to be approved by Bond Attorney. Said bid form to provide that bidder deposit with bid a certified or Cashiers check to the amount of 2% of bid guaranteeing compliance with terms of same or to be forfeited to County as liquidated damages.

Fourth: That in consideration of our services as above set forth we are to be paid at the time of payment in full for bonds by purchaser of same, the sum of three quarters of one per-cent of the face value of bonds sold; Such payment to be made to us concurrently with the delivery of bonds to purchaser in proportion to the amount of bonds actually delivered and paid for as from time to time said bonds may be sold and delivered. In the event there be no satisfactory offer submitted for bonds at the first advertised sale thereof, then we shall continue to represent your County in the issuance and sale of bonds until such time as bid for bonds may be accepted by you.

Fifth: We will furnish the Clerk of your Board with a list of not less than fifty Bond dealers to whom descriptive circulars have been furnished, and will forward to Clerk a supply for direct distribution. If in the opinion of our Attorneys a Circuit Court validation be not required, we agree to have proceeding completed and bonds advertised for sale by Saturday, July 23rd, 1927 and should validation be required, or other legal proceeding be had then within five weeks of the final determination of such validation or legal proceedings. In the event the issues are contested, you are to arrange for and provide counsel our Bond Attorney will however, without charge consult with and advise your attorney, fee to be paid your counsel only out of proceeds of bonds if and when sold.

Mr. Orr, representing Wright, Warlow & Co., Orlando, Fla., appeared before the Board and made a verbal proposition of validating the bond issues for 3/4 of 1%, same as Mr. Sawyers did, but did not produce his proposition to writing.

There was several bond buyers before the Board in regard to purchasing the proposed bond issues, but the board could not take any actions in reference to sale of same at this time.

Miss Yeamans, County Home Dem. Agent was before the Board in regard her work.

The Board agreed to go and inspect the Road from A R Holley's to Bay County line being built under contract with C G Gainey on to-morrow.

Mr. Bryon W. Collins of Santa Rosa, Fla. appeared before the Board with a letter from the citizens of the Santa Rosa district in regard to the relations with the people on the South side of Choctawhatchee Bay and the North side thereof, which was received, read and Mr. Collins was invited to attend the meetings of this Board any time it was convenient.

After considerable discussion pro and con, upon motion made by G M Bishop, seconded by J J Ward and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that the proposition submitted by G B Sawyers & Co. of Jacksonville, Fla. in regard to the bond issues be accepted, and the Chairman and Clerk of this Board be and they are hereby authorized and directed to accept the same in the name of said Board.

The members of this Board having inspected the claying of the road from near New Home Church or School House to near Ben Infinger's mail under contract with S M Mitchem, and finding that Mr Mitchem had complied with his contract, it was ordered that the same be accepted, and the Clerk was authorized to deliver the warrant in payment thereof.

This Board having been advised by Hon. Ernest Amos, State Comptroller, under date of June 6th, 1927, that there was an act passed by the recent Session of the Florida Legislature requiring the Board of County Commissioners of each County to designate or re-designate the County Depositories, the said act being, "An Act to Amend Section 1567, Revised General Statutes of Florida, - - - - -"

Upon motion made by Commissioner G M Bishop, seconded by Commissioner W M Infinger, and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that The First National Bank of DeFuniak Springs, Florida, is hereby designated as a County Depository for the deposit of the following and other funds subject to the Act of 1921, Chapter 8527, and amendment thereto in 1927, of the Laws of Florida, and to the agreements or surety bonds executed under the law, For General Revenue Fund, Mother's Pension Fund, Fine and Forfeiture Fund, Publicity Fund, Interest & Sinking Fund for Special Road & Bdge Di. #3, Interest & Sinking Fund for Special Road & Bdge D. #1, (\$10,000.00 Time Deposit on Road & Bridge Fund,) and 1/2 Walton County Court House Bond Fund, the highest amount of deposits at any time expected to be \$55,000.00. The Amount of bonds or securities required, \$50,000.00 for the present, and further ordered that the bonds and securities given at this time is sufficient and the said Bank is not required to give a new bond or securities at this time.

And further ordered that The Cawthon State Bank of DeFuniak Springs, Florida, is hereby designated as a County Depository for the deposit of the following and other funds subject to the Act of 1921, Chapter 8527, and amendment thereto in 1927, of the Laws of Florida, and to the agreements or surety bonds executed under the law, for the Road and Bridge Fund, Agriculture & Live Stock Fund, 1/2 Walton County Court House Bond Fund, Interest & Sinking Fund for Court House Bonds, Interest & Sinking Fund for Special Road and Bridge District #2, and the highest amount of deposits at any time expected to be \$55,000.00. The amount of bonds or securities required, \$50,000.00 for the present, and further ordered that the bonds and securities given at this time is sufficient and the said Bank is not required to give a new bond or securities at this time.

It was ordered that the Board take a re-cess until 5 o'clock P.M., to-morrow, June 15th, A. D. 1927.
