Jones, Tax Collector, then presented his Insolvent Report of errors, insolvencies and double assessments for the year A D 1926, and the Board having carefully examined and compared the same, it was ordered that the same be accepted and the Tax Collector be given credit for the following amounts,- General Revenue Fund \$1,290.65, Mother's Pension Fund \$129.06, Road and Bridge Fund \$1,290.65, Fine and Forfeiture Fund \$516.35, Agriculture and Live Stock Fund \$129.06, General School Fund \$2,581.30, Interest and Sinking Fund for Court House Bonds \$1,032.50, Publicity Fund \$516.34, Total \$7,485.90, Poll Taxes \$892.00, Interest and Sinking Fund for Special Road & Bridge District No.1, \$554.58, Sub-School Districts \$2,156.99, Bonded School Districts Nos. 1, 3 & 16 \$464.88, Total \$4,068.45, making a Grand Total \$11,554.35.

Upon Motion made by G M Bishop, seconded by R L Jones and duly carried, ordered that Commissioner J J Ward be instructed to proceed to Calhoun County and negotiate with Commissioners of Calhoun County toward releasing to them Walton County prisoners from Oct. 1st, 1927 to Oct. 1st, 1928, and make an effort to secure settlement from Calhoun County for the amount now due Walton County for use of Walton County prisoners.

Mr. John Anderson, appeared before the Board and requested that the Board open up road from Slay place to connect with Glendale and Argyle road, the matter was referred to G M Bishop for further consideration and action.

It was ordered that the Clerk of this Board have published in the DeFuniak Herald that this Board would receive sealed bids until 10 o'clock A.M. Saturday, October 29th, 1927, for the purchase of one Road Grader with tractor hitch, back sloper and scarifier of suitable size and weight to be used in the construction of roads when pulled by a tractor of the weight of five tons. Price to be delivered to DeFuniak Springs, Fla. Bidder to name approximate date of delivery and Board to reserve the right to reject any and all bids.

Also notice that this Board would receive sealed bids until 10 o'clock A.M. Saturday, October 29th, 1927 for the purchase of one Car approximately 1500 feet, metal culverts, price to be F O B DeFuniak Spgs, Fla. Bidders to name approximate date of delivery. Board reserving the right to reject any and all bids.

Also notice that this Board would receive sealed bids until 10 o'clock A.M., Saturday, October 29th, 1927, for the purchase of one crawler type Tractor of approximately 5 tons in weight, price to be F O B DeFuniak Spgs, Fla. Bidders to name approximate date of delivery. Board reserving the right to reject any and all bids.

Also notice that this Board would receive sealed bids until 10 o'clock A.M., Saturday, October 29th, 1927, for the clearing of a road-way 40 ft wide beginning at the bridge across Little Alaqua creek near the Sconiersold mill and running approximately North as now staked out 2640 feet. (one-half mile) being approximately 2.3 acres, also for the

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clearing of a road-way 30 feet wide beginning at the western boundard line fence of Sconiers old farm and following the line of stakes now set in a northerly and westerly direction for 2640 feet (one-half mile) being approximately 1.8 acres.

All trees and stumps under 4" in diameter to be pulled, all smaller trees and groth to be grubbed and all roots over 1" in diameter to be grubbed. All holes made from pulling or grubbing to be filled after the job of pulling and grubbing has been accepted by the Board of County Commissioners.

All obstructions of every kind to be removed from road-way, and road-way shall be left in a condition ready for the grading up of same for road.

All bids will be marked on outside of envelope "Bids for Clearing" and said bids shall be accompanied by a cashiers check paying to the order of the Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida, for the sum of \$50. which will insure that the successful bidder will promptly enter into a contract to perform the services indicated, and will make a bond for the carrying out of said contract in the sum of 50% of the amount bid. Bidder will name the time required for the completion of contract if awarded. Board reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

There was several application for Mother's Pension claims which was taken by the various Commissioners for further consideration before any action by the Board.

The Board then adjourned to meet in Special Session on Saturday, October 29th, 1927.
