

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida, met in regular session on this Tuesday, November 8th, A D 1927, with the following members present and participating, W I Stinson, Chairman, G M Bishop, R L Jones, J J Ward and W M Infinger and M T Fountain, Clerk of said Board.

W. I. Stinson, deposited with the Clerk the sum of \$6.00 as road tax from District No.3, and the sum of \$50.00 - proceeds received from the sale of the old vault door in Tax Collector's office in the old Court House.

G M Bishop, deposited with the Clerk the sum of \$20.00 as road tax from District No.1, (\$8.00 by C E Matthews, Road Overseer and \$12.00 from Carlton Bishop, Road Overseer.)

W F Jones, Tax Collector filed his report of 1926 polls collected for the month ending October 31st, 1927, showing \$11.00 collected, and his report of licenses collected for the same period showing \$678.60 collected for the State and \$346.80 for Walton County.

Mr R W Rushing filed with the Clerk of this Board a bond for a duplicate warrant to be issued in place of the original warrant #641, issued on April 27th, 1927, for \$2.70 on the Interest and Sinking Fund of Special Road & Bridge Dist. #3, with M T King and T P Rushing as sureties, upon motion of G M Bishop, seconded by W M Infinger and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that the Bond be approved and the Chairman and Clerk of this Board be and they are hereby authorized and directed to issue a duplicate for same.

Mr H J Henderson, M T Manning et al was before the Board in regard to using the old Jackson Lumber Co's log road as a public road from DeFuniak Springs to Gaskin later to be designated as a public road and mail route road, and after considerable discussion, Mr Manning explaining to the Board that his company would be willing to lease this old log road to the County for a certain number of years, but would reserve the right to use it again as a log road, and the Board having considered same, delayed any definite actions for the time being.

It was ordered that the following bonds be approved.-

Notary Public Bond of M J Parish, \$500. with R W Parish and H J Henderson as sureties was approved.

Notary Public bond of R W Parish, \$500. was approved with M J Parish and G T Anderson as sureties.

Notary Public bond of (Miss) Ophelia Campbell, \$500. was approved with American Surety Company of New York as surety.

A Duplicate Notary Public bond of (Miss) Mamie Hilson, \$500. was approved with American Surety Company of New York as surety.

Mr J J Ward advised the Board that a petition having been presented to him asking the Board to grant a public road leading from near Wise Bluff to Rooks Bluff be declared and designated as a public road, but he failing to bring it with him this morning, but agreeing to mail it to the Clerk at once, and after explaining the need of such a road, thereupon motion of Commissioner J J Ward, seconded by Commissioner G M Bishop and duly carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that the Road leading from Wise Bluff in Walton County to Rooks Bluff in Walton County be and the same is hereby designated and declared a public road of Walton County, Florida.

Upon motion made by J J Ward, seconded by G M Bishop and duly carried, ordered that the name of Senia Infinger, Bruce, Fla. be placed upon the Paupers List to receive the sum of \$5.00 per month until further orders of this Board,-

And further ordered that the name of Lafayette Love of Pt. Washington, Fla. be placed upon the paupers List to receive the sum of \$5.00 per month until further orders of this Board.

The Semi-annual Report of County Finances for the period ending September 30th, 1927, as prepared by the Clerk was approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

W. F. Jones, Tax Collector filed a Supplemental Insolvent Report showing \$24,194.32 uncollected on Special Road & Bridge Dist. #3, the question of collecting this tax having been settled by a decision of the State Supreme Court, it was ordered that this report be accepted and approved and the Tax Collector given credit for said amount on his account of the 1926 assessment roll.

The Board Certified the name of Mamie Hallie, (colored) under Sec. 4, Chapter 5209, to the Florida State School for the Deaf and the Blind.

Request having been received on Oct. 5th, 1927, from Warren-Knight & Davis and Yonge associate architects asking the Board to return to them their \$200.00 certified check deposited with their Bid in reference to plans and specifications for the building a new County Jail, and

Whereas, the matter of formally signing a contract and executing bond has been delayed for reasons beyond their control.

Now, therefore be it Resolved, that the Clerk of this Board be instructed to return to them their check in the sum of \$200.00 deposited with their bid.

Moved by J J Ward, seconded by G M Bishop and duly carried by unanimous vote of all members, ordered that the above and foregoing resolution be adopted.

Upon motion of Commissioner J J Ward, seconded by Commissioner R L Jones and duly carried by unanimous vote of all members present, it was ordered that the Clerk of this Board be and he is hereby directed to notify Governor John W. Martin that the sureties on the bond of
/ A. R. Campbell, County Judge are dead.

Mr S T Harrison, et als from near Darlington was before the Board in regard to a hill on road leading to a school house and the board having heard from interested parties, agreed to go and inspect same Thursday, Nov. 10, 1927.

The Deputy Sheriff Bond of C M Tidwell was not approved because the oath of office was not attached to the bond and neither one of the sureties had justified to the said bond as required by law.

Moved by J J Ward, seconded by G M Bishop, ordered that Warrant #17081 made in favor of Sarah Nowling for \$5.00 be cancelled and her name stricken from the pauper's List for the reasons she is now dead.

The County having purchased a new Tractor and Road Machine, the following named persons applied for the following positions,- For work on Grader, J L Bell, J W Helms, Jodia Floyd and Dewey Infinger, for work driving Tractor,- M C Burch, Green Floyd and H H Nowing, and the County Commissioners having considered the qualifications of each man, employed M C Burch as Tractor Driver, time to begin when Tractor is received, at the salary of \$115.00 per month, until further orders of this Board. The Board decided not to employ a Grader man at this time.

Mr E H Miller, Hiltz Crook, D E Douglass, et al from Freeport appeared before the Board in regard to the survey of State Road No.10, near Freeport, and asked the Commissioners

to advise them and assist them in getting the State Road Department to re-survey the Route# State Road No.10, thru Freeport, which was agreed to by the Board.

It was ordered that F A Strickland furnish 10 racks of dry pine, 5 racks of green pine and 10 racks of oak wood for use in warming the cells of the jail to keep the prisoners price of pine \$2.50 per rack and oak wood \$3.00 per rack.

Mr Bryon W Collins, Andrew Thompson and Lynn L Nealley of Santa Rosa, appeared before the Board in regard to why Mr Collins was appointed to appear before the Board at each meeting, which was fully explained by Mr Nealley, et al. (The presence of Mr Collins being explained by Mr Nealley, states that he is sent over here for the purpose of obtaining information as to the actions of the County Commissioners as the local newspapers gives very little news,
if any, what the board does.)

The Board then adjourned until November 16th, A. D. 1927.
