

TUESDAY, October 8th, A D 1929.

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida, met in regular adjourned session on this Tuesday, October 8th, A D 1929, pursuant to a recess of yesterday, October 7th, 1929, with the following members present and participating, - W I Stinson, Chairman, Angus Green, R L Jones, J J Ward and W M Infinger, being all the members of said Board and M T Fountain, Clerk.

W T Ray, Tax Collector, filed his report of Polls collected for the month ending Sept. 30th, 1929, showing \$20.00 collected, and his report of Licenses collected for the same period showing \$1.50 collected for the State and 75¢ collected for Walton County.

Mr M G Green and other citizens from in and near Darlington appeared before the Board in regard to the condition of the Road between Darlington and DeFuniak Springs, Fla., especially that part in Commissioner's district No.2, stated that the same was almost impassable, and the Board agreed to call this to the attention of Comr. Jones for his consideration and attention.

The Minutes of the meetings of this Board held on June 11th, July 1st, 8th, 23rd, and 29th, August 13th, 26th and 31st, and September 2nd, 1929, was read by the Clerk, upon motion made by Comr. J J Ward, seconded by Comr. Angus Green and duly carried by unanimous vote, was ordered approved as read.

Mr G W Byrd appeared before the Board in regard to his claim for addition compensation ~~he~~ ^{and} claims on various projects he constructed under contracts from the proceeds of \$1,250,000, stating that he would submit his claim to the Board at a latter date.

Mr S K Gillis, Attorney, appeared before the Board in regard to Mrs M V Gibson property on State Road #33 and W F Cockcroft property on State Road #40, but the Board took no action in either case.

The Board discussed the application for Mothers' Pension Claims under a new law recently passed by the 1929 Legislature and agreed to refer each claim to the Commissioner from whose district the claimant resides in for his investigation and report further to this Board his findings.

The question of revising the Paupers list then came up for consideration and after considerable discussion, upon motion of Comr. W M Infinger, seconded by Comr. R L Jones and duly

carried by unanimous vote, it was ordered that the following named persons be placed upon the Paupers list to receive the following amounts per month until further orders of this Board,-

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Upon motion of Comr. Angus Green, seconded by Comr. J J Ward and duly carried by unanimous vote, it is ordered that the following resolution be adopted,-

Whereas, there remain the sum of \$432.09 in the Court House Bond Fund, derived from the sale of \$150,000 Court House Bonds during 1925, and the Court House and grounds now being completed, and

Whereas, the recent hurricane did some damage to the Court House building, and the Board desires to make the proper repairs and paint a part of the building.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the State Comptroller of the State of Florida is hereby requested to authorize this Board to expend this sum, or so much thereof is necessary, to make the proper repairs and repaint as much of the building as possible.
