

SPECIAL MEETING - WEDNESDAY, December 18th, 1929.

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida, met in Special Session on this Wednesday, December 18th, 1929, pursuant to call of its Chairman, Mr W I Stinson, with the following members present and participating, - W I Stinson, Chairman, J J Ward, Angus Green and R L Jones, being all the members of said Board and M T Fountain, Clerk.

Mr. Stinson, announced that the meeting was called for the purpose of discussing the conditions in Commissioner's District #4, on account of the death of W M Infinger, on December 14th, and such other business as might come before the Board.

After consider discussion, on motion of Comr. J J Ward, seconded by Comr. Angus Green, it was ordered that B J Infinger, Road Foreman for the late W M Infinger of District 4 turn over at once to Capt. J S Gaston, County Convict Warden all the property of every kind, used in said District #4 in the construction and maintenance of the roads of said district, and that he make a list of the property so transferred and turn same into the Clerk of this Board prâperly signed by himself and Capt. J S Gaston, it was further ordered that all maintenance and construction work by County forces be dis-continued in this district until a successor to the late W M Infinger has been named and has qualified, the Commissioner from district #3 is authorized to act in case an emergency should arise in said district prior to the qualification of the new commissioner.

Convict Guard bond of H A Bozeman, \$1000 with C M Flow and W S Matthews as sureties was approved as provided by Law.

Mr Henry Jernigan of Portland appeared before the Board in regard to moving and rebuilding his house on account of right-of-way for State Road #10, and after considerable discussion it was agreed between Mr Jernigan and the Board that Walton County would pay Mr Jernigan the sum of \$150.00 the estimated costs of moving and rebuilding his home and let him assume all responsibility of damages to same.

Moved by J J Ward, seconded by R L Jones and duly carried, the following resolution was adopted,-

Whereas, It has pleased the Almighty ^{God} to remove from our midst, by death, our esteemed friend and co-laborer, W. M. Infinger, who has for many years occupied a prominent rank in our midst.

Therefore, Resolved, That in the death of Mr. Infinger we have sustained the loss of a friend whose fellowship it was an honor and a pleasure to enjoy, that we bear willing testimony to his many virtues, that we offer to his bereaved family and mourning friends, over whom sorrow has hung her sable mantle, our heartfelt condolence, and pray that Infinite Goodness may bring speedy relief to their burdened hearts and inspire them with the consolations that Hope in futurity and Faith in God given even in the shadow of the Tomb.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolution, properly engrossed, be presented to the family of our deceased friend.
