

THURSDAY, Dec. 12, 1935.

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida, met in regular adjourned session on this Thursday, December 12th, 1935, at 2 P M, pursuant to adjournment of Tuesday, Dec. 10th, 1935, with the following members present and participating, O Dr. L F Cawthon, Chairman, M C Burke, J W Weeks, M M Adkison and J J Sharon, being all the members of said Board and M T Fountain, Clerk, together with D Stuart Gillis, County Attorney, and D C Adkinson, Tax Assessor.

At the request of W O Campbell, the Board resolved itself into a TAX ADJUSTMENT BOARD as now provided by law, and W O Campbell, presented to Tax Adjustment Board an application to adjust delinquent taxes on Lot 9 Sub. Div. of Lot 498, moved by Comr. Sharon, seconded by Comr. Weeks and duly carried by unanimous vote, ordered that W O Campbell & J A Vaughan be allowed to redeem delinquent taxes on this lot at par without interest on county taxes.

The Board then adjourned as a Tax Adjustment Board and proceeded with its business as a Board of County Commissioners.

Confederate Widow's pension of Mrs Ben Holman, widow of Ben Holman who died Nov. 27, 1935, and who was a member of the Home Guard was approved as required by law.

Letter from W D Port of Santa Rosa, reference Aviation Field at or near Santa Rosa, was read to the Board and after discussing same with Judge Gillis, the Clerk was advised to write him county could not spend public funds for aviation field.

The Board then discussed the matter of issuing refund/<sup>ing</sup>bonds for Court House Bonds, dated Oct. 1, 1925, and Judge Gillis was requested to advise this Board what procedure necessary to issue refunding bonds.

The telegrams from Attorney-General Landis and State Auditor Bryon Willis, reference commission due Tax Assessor for assessing taxes for bonded school and special school districts was read and discussed and Judge Gillis advised the Board he knew of no laws contrary to these telegrams.

The Clerk then read the minutes of the meetings of this Board held on Sept. 2, 3, 4, 6, 20th, 30th, Oct. 4th, 8th, 1935, moved by Comr. M M Adkison, seconded by Comr. J J Sharon, and duly carried, were ordered approved as read.

Pauper applications were then considered and approved, and warrants ordered drawn against the General Revenue Fund in the sum of \$16.00.

The Board then adjourned to meet in regular session on Tuesday, January 7th, 1936, on account of Circuit Court during the second Tuesday in January, 1936.
