

MONDAY, JANUARY 3, 1955

The Board of County Commissioners, Walton County, Florida, met at 11:00 A. M. on Monday, January 5, 1955, with the following members present: H. A. Bodiford, J. D. Sharon, G. A. McLeod, W. E. McIntosh, and Newton Hinote, together with E. Leo Andrews, Clerk, and Weba Paul, Deputy Clerk. The following proceedings were had and done.

The Chairman, H. A. Bodiford, announced that a principal purpose of this meeting was to approve for payment the outstanding bills. The Board then proceeded to examine and approve the bills and, upon motion of Commissioner McIntosh, seconded by Commissioner Hinote, the Board voted to pay all approved bills and instructed the Clerk to issue warrants as follows:

From the General Revenue Fund	\$ 7,882.09

From the Mosquito Control Fund	\$ 37.16

The following letter was read by the Chairman:

Gentlemen:

Effective January 3, 1955, I herewith tender my resignation as County Prosecuting Attorney and Attorney for the Board of County Commissioners.

It has been a pleasure to serve the County as Prosecuting Attorney and to serve your body as legal adviser during the past several years, but I feel that at this time it will be to the best interest of the board, to the County and to me for someone else to have this work. I do not feel that I can consistently represent the Board of County Commissioners and carry out the program which I have planned for the forthcoming session of the legislature. I have in mind passing some legislation which would be inconsistent with my employment by the board.

I want you gentlemen to understand it shall always be a pleasure to work with you for the best interest of Walton County, and I trust that you will not hesitate to call on me when I can be of assistance to you or to the County in any way whatsoever, and I want you to understand that I am grateful to you for your favorable consideration of me during the time in which I have been in your employment.
