MARCH 10, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida met in regular session on March 10th, 1964 with the following members present and participating: Commissioner Kylea Laird, Chairman, Commissioner Hubert Bell, Vice Chairman, Commissioner 0. 0. Thompson, Mr. Commissioner W. Frank Adams, Commissioner Marvin Rigdon together with W. Paul Thompson, Attorney to the Board and Forrest A. McDonald, Deputy Clerk

Bills for the month of February were presented to the Board for approval for payment. After examination and upon a motion by Commissioner Bell seconded by Commissioner Thompson the Board voted unanimously to pay said bills. The Clerk was authorized to issue warrants in the following amounts:

Mr. H. O. Harrison, County Agent, Mr. John Carver, Coordinator for the Rural Renewal Program for Holmes and Walton and Washington Counties and Mr. Jim McCall, Rural Area Development Coordinator for West Florida and Mr. Paul Teelin, Chairman, Walton County Development appeared before the Board regarding the Rural Renewal Program for Walton County, Florida.

Motion by Commissioner Bell seconded by Commissioner Thompson to let the Walton County Development Authority sponsor the Rural Renewal Program for Walton County. Passed by unanimous vote of the Board.

The Rural Renewal Program is a Federal Program and Coordinated by

Farmers Home Administration and they have the Authority for lending and are known as the Rural Renewal loans No Project loan will ever be made until presented to the Board of County Commissioners first for their attention and for their sanction on it.

Mr. Johnny Holleman from the Hugo Marx and Company, Investment Brokers of Montgomery, Alabama was present before the Board and talked to the Commissioners about refinancing the Court House bonds. The Commissioners asked Mr. Holleman to submit a plan for re-financing the Court House Bond Program for their study.

A letter was received by the Board from Mrs. J. B. Porter regarding the roads in District # 2 along Okaloosa and Walton County lines. No action by the Board.

A bill was presented to the Board regarding Mr. Tucker from Indiana who was admitted to Florida State Hospital from Walton County. Since Mr. Thomas Lee Tucker did not qualify as a resident from the State of Florida he was transported to his home State of Indiana by the Florida State Hospital and the amount of the bill was for \$307.41. The bill was approved by the Board and ordered paid.

Mrs. Inez Brown appeared before the Board with a petition requesting the road by the Methodist Church in Portland to remain open. The Clerk was instructed to file the petition and the Attorney to the Board was advised not to advertise for closing of the road as previously agreed by the Board.

Mr. N. E. Campbell and Mr. Paul Teelin of the Food for the Needy

Committee also Representative Jimmy Prescott appeared before the Board and reported

on the Food for the Needy Program. The report is as follows: -

The Committee appointed to study the Distribution of Foods to Needy

Households met on February 10, 1964 in the Underwood Building In DeFuniak Springs, Fla., at 7:30 P. M. Present Mrs. Doggette, Miss Campbell, Mr. Teelan and Chairman Campbell. Mr. Cadenhead was absent because of Illness.

It as mutually agreed that there was a need for fool(sp) for needy families

In Walton County. There are many persons on welfare and other low income groups that find it very difficult to get wholesome food. We know of no other source from which the necessary help can be obtained, and we therefore recommend that this program be adopted as soon as possible from reliable sources we found that there are about 2100 persons on welfare in Walton County. In other counties the total number of persons receiving food from this program is about double the number on welfare, therefore, we estimate that there would be about 4000 persons in Walton County who could qualify for this food. Under this program the following items are given away, peas, butter, cheese, corn meal, flour, lard, rice, peanut butter and cereal.(sp). The retail value of food allowed one person is about \$6.50 per month. If our estimate of 4000 persons is correct then the retail value of food distributed in our county would be more than \$24000.00 per month, or, if it was decided to distribute only dry or non-cold storage foods the retail value of one person's monthly allotment would be \$4.50, and a total distribution of more than \$17000.00 per month.

Most of this good is shipped car lot, and prepaid to the county however,

it is the responsibility of the county to unload and store the food; therefore, the cost for operation becomes largely, a problem of labor. We have estimated a budget and the total operation would cost a maximum of \$1150.00 per mo.

A copy of this budget is attached -a quick glance will show that if the county could arrange to use one of its own buildings that is presently supplied with water and lights a nice saving could be made. If prison or other labor presently available could be used the labor bill could be cut almost in helf.

giving the freeholders in Pots 15,l8 and 29 an opportunity to express themselves by ballot
on the May 26th Primary. Passed by unanimous vote of the Board.

Mrs. Minnie Harrison, Deputy Clerk to the Supervisor of Registration office appeared before the Board and reported that over 15% of voters in these precincts in fact 210 of the 418 qualified voters of the pcts 15,18 and 29 has signed the petition.

The following advertisement was authorized published by the

Board in compliance with Chapter 388.031, Florida Statutes.

NOTICE OF ELECTION

The Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida, hereby declares that it has determined that a petition has been duly signed and submitted by the requisite number of registered electors who are freeholders residing within the territory described on said petition, requesting the creation of a Mosquito Control District therein and that the creation of such a district is feasible and practicable to eradicate or control mosquitoes and other arthropods in said territory and that the Board of County Commissioners of Walton County, Florida at its regular meeting on the 10th day of March 1964 fixed May 26th, 1964 as the date for said election and determined that the name of the District shall be the South Walton County Mosquito Control District, should the electors determine to create such a district and that its boundaries would be as follows:

The territory to be included in the proposed district shall be bounded on the South by the Gulf of Mexico. The East Boundary of the district shall be that portion of the Walton-Bay County line from the Gulf of Mexico to the Choctawhatchee River. This line shall then be projected northward along the line dividing Range 17 West and Range 18 West to the northeast corner of Section 12, Range 16 West, Township 2 South. This shall be the northeast corner of the district.

The northern boundary shall begin at the northeast corner and extend westerly along with section line forming the south boundary of Sections

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, Range 18 West, Township 2 South, until said line intersects the highwater mark at the eastern tip of Jolly Bay. At this point the northern boundary shall follow the high tide water mark contour around Choctawhatchee Bay and its tributaries until reaching the Walton-Okaloosa County line.

The West boundary of the district shall be that portion of the Walton-Okaloosa County line extending from the high tide water mark on the north shore of Choctawhatchee to the Gulf of Mexico.

All registered voters, who are freeholders and reside within the above described territory, are eligible to vote for or against the creation of said Mosquito Control District and to elect the District Board of Commissioners.
